

MATH 817 ASSIGNMENT 4

- (1) (Rotman problem 7.29 iii, iv, v) Let A and B be (fixed) objects in a category \mathcal{C} . Define a new category \mathcal{C}' whose objects are diagrams

$$A \xrightarrow{\alpha} C \xleftarrow{\beta} B$$

where C is an object in \mathcal{C} and α and β are morphisms in \mathcal{C} . Define a morphism in \mathcal{C}' to be a morphism θ in \mathcal{C} that makes the following diagram commute

$$\begin{array}{ccccc} A & \xrightarrow{\alpha} & C & \xleftarrow{\beta} & B \\ \downarrow \text{id}_A & & \downarrow \theta & & \downarrow \text{id}_B \\ A & \xrightarrow{\alpha'} & C' & \xleftarrow{\beta'} & B \end{array}$$

There is an obvious candidate for composition and identity morphisms.

- Prove that \mathcal{C}' is a category.
 - Prove that an initial object in \mathcal{C}' is a coproduct in \mathcal{C} .
 - Give an analogous construction showing that a product is a terminal object in a suitable category.
- (2) Show that pullbacks exist in the category of abelian groups. *Hint: Let A, B, C be abelian groups with homomorphisms $\phi : A \rightarrow C$, $\psi : B \rightarrow C$. Build the pullback as pairs (a, b) with $a \in A$, $b \in B$, and with certain restrictions on a and b .*
- (3) (Rotman problem 7.38) Prove that there is a functor from the category of groups to the category of abelian groups taking G to G/G' .
- (4) (Joy of Cats definition 6.9 and example 6.11.1b) A functor $F : \mathcal{A} \rightarrow \text{Set}$ is called *representable* (by an \mathcal{A} -object A) provided that F is naturally isomorphic to the hom-functor $\text{Hom}(A, -) : \mathcal{A} \rightarrow \text{Set}$, i.e. provided that there is a natural transformation $\tau : F \rightarrow \text{Hom}(A, -)$ where each τ_A is an isomorphism. Show that the forgetful functor from groups to sets is represented by \mathbb{Z} .
- (5) (Isaacs problem 10.2) Let $G = D_8 \times Z_2$ where D_8 is the dihedral group of order 8 and Z_2 is cyclic of order 2. Let $X = \{x\}$ be a singleton set. Show how to make G into an X -group so that $Z(G)$ is not an X -subgroup.
